Definitions

What do we generally mean by culture and cultural heritage?

Culture

- Distinct spiritual, material, intellectual, and emotional **features characterizing a society**
- Arts, lifestyle, human rights, value systems, traditions, and beliefs

Cultural heritage

- Artefacts, monuments, groups of buildings and sites, museums that have a diversity of values including symbolic, historic, artistic, aesthetic, ethnological or anthropological, scientific and social significance
- **Tangible** heritage (movable, immobile and underwater)
- **Intangible** cultural heritage **embedded** into cultural, and natural heritage artefacts, sites or monuments

Culture and cultural heritage

European frameworks for action

Culture and Cultural Heritage are vital components of urban identity, social cohesion, and economic development. EU aims to promote cultural diversity, foster intercultural dialogue, and support the preservation and enhancement of Culture and Cultural Heritage in urban environments to create vibrant, more just and inclusive cities.


Which culture and cultural heritage?







Culture and cultural heritage and Urban Planning





Culture and cultural heritage and contestation

- Questions around contestation, intersectionality, (de-)colonisation, appropriation, cooptation, banishment, erasure, displacement, mainstreaming dominant cultural vision, "b/order" history & culture...
- Tangible and intangible aspects
- Never a given but a process
- Related to hic and nunc -relationship between place, knowledge and power- dissonant
- Cultural and cultural heritage inherently political
- Tensions between social environmental and economic aspects





Culture and cultural heritage and the "ecological conversions"


- Art of inter-ethnid togetherness (not forced inclusion and not creation of exclusion)
- Awareness of limits (of the resources)
- Community organizing for an effective quadruple helix, a form of PPPP, which secures the implementation and the legacy of a transformative change
- "Ecological conversion" (Langer)

The decisive question is: how can an ecologically sustainable civilization be desirable?

...not so much to be what should or should not be done, but how to arouse motivations and impulses that make the turning point towards a course correction possible.





Practices matter

- The connection between **local contexts and larger EU frameworks** (principles and political directions unfold into actions performed at local level).
- Practices as the **horizontal connection between different cities** (a dialogue based on locally developed initiatives as the occasion to confront).
- A cooperative discussion on **how to adapt, adopt and transfer good practices** in other contexts: highlighting the most innovative and useful aspects of what has been experienced so far.
- A reflection on **what can and should be changed**: more and different things could be put in place (practically). How does the policy framework can incorporate and stimulate change?

Cohesion policy support for culture and cultural heritage

Approach


- Support is possible under new dedicated Specific Objective 4.6: 'Enhancing the role of culture and sustainable tourism in economic development, social inclusion and social innovation' and under other Policy Objectives
- Culture important driver of social, economic and territorial cohesion and development and for shared sense of European identity and values
- Vulnerability of cultural sector to external shocks - Covid crisis was booster for strengthening social, environmental and economic sustainability and resilience of this sector

Investments

- Investments should consider need of cultural sector's transformation in a manner that strengthens sustainability and resilience of sector in long term
- They should also provide broader access to culture, reaching out to wider audiences, with positive impact on local communities and creation of stable and quality employment
- They should align with policy lines of different strategic frameworks
- They should follow best practices and recommendations of key principles and declarations

Programmed support for culture and cultural heritage

2021-2027 ERDF direct support EUR 5.4 billion*



- Mostly under dedicated specific ERDF objective (RSO4.6) or as part of integrated sustainable territorial development strategies under Policy Objective 5
- Broad scope of support, including across cultural and creativity sectors
- Commitments to New European
 Bauhaus, ICOMOS European Quality
 Principles and other key documents
- Synergies with other initiatives, e.g. Creative Europe, European Capitals of Culture, European Heritage Label...

Examples of actions included in 2021-2027 programmes

- Cultural infrastructure and equipment (museums, libraries, galleries, theatres, visitor centres, archives, cultural & creative hubs, cinemas, cultural routes)
- Conservation, preservation, revitalisation and promotion of cultural heritage (tangible & intangible)
- Digitalisation measures (e.g. digital platforms, new technologies and ICT for enhancement of experiences, management & conservation, accessibility & promotion efforts)
- Energy efficiency and greening measures (renewable energy, circular business models, climate change adaptation plans)

- Support for long-term measures for social inclusion, social economy and social innovation facilitating equal access to culture (including new audiences, community spaces, arts & craft activities, exhibitions)
- Support for cultural tourism
- Restoration of cultural heritage as part of regeneration of public spaces
- Support for skills development to support twin green and digital transition (including entrepreneurship skills) (Interreg & cross-financing with ESF+)

Example of Cohesion policy support: new cultural life for historic factory complex in Rijeka



New cultural life for historic factory complex in Rijeka, Croatia

- Abandoned industrial area in Rijeka (HR) transformed into modern cultural district with city's museum, library, and creative space for children
- Investment formed part of Rijeka 2020 European Capital of Culture project (EUR 15,8 ml. from ERDF 2014-2020)



- Retrofitting historic 16th century building in Valletta (MT) to become green-powered, energy-friendly and to accommodate Malta National Community Art Museum (MUZA)
 - Improvement of energy performance, reinforcing original and energy efficient features
- EUR 7,3 ml. from ERDF 2014-2020
- Flagship project for Valletta's European Capital City of Culture in 2018
