



The EU Ministers responsible for Urban Matters gathered at Brdo pri Kranju (Slovenia) on 26 November 2021 for the Informal Ministerial Meeting. The meeting was also attended by the European Commissioner for Regional Policy and representatives from the European Patiliament (EP). Committee of the Regions (COP). European Economic and Social Committee (EESC). European Investment Bank (EIB). Euroclies and Council of European Municipalities and Regions (CEMR), as well as Norway and Switzerland and several observers.

Today's global challenges are complex and intertwined. They require a multi-level and multi-sectoral response, combining urban and territorial interventions. In times of disruption, it is in towns and cities where place-based, citizen-centred responses emerge and are applied. Whether it is the mitigation of and adaptation to climate change, countering the loss of blodiversity, or managing health crises like the current pandemic: a fair recovery should be based on a green and digital transition. Many cities are leading this process of change and pursuing the principles for just, green and productive cities. The New Leipzig Charter rightly emphasises the transformative power of cities for the common good. National urban policies, developed in close collaboration with urban authorities and other stakeholders at regional and local level, can contribute considerably to the implementation of the New Leipzig Charter and Urban Agenda for the EU and therefore ensure improvement of the quality of life for all European citizens.

Cooperation on urban matters in Europe is a case in point: the goal of achieving climateneutrality by 2050 requires a multi-level and multi-stakeholder approach to urban development. Building on decades of informal intergovernmental cooperation on urban matters, the Pact of Amsterdam launched the Urban Agenda for the EU (UAEU), and ushered in a new phase. For the first time, cities of different sizes were at the centre of an initiative that aimed to find joint solutions in direct dialogue with Members States, the European Commission, and other stakeholders. In that context the chance to develop this approach in cooperation with different initiatives such as the new Horizon Europe Mission to achieve 100 climate neutral cities by 2030 is very welcome.

The UAEU has introduced new working methods to urban policy and practice. It is viewed by urban stakeholders as a remarkable case and indeed experience of multi-level governance, one that has enabled cities to explain the impacts and challenges they face on the ground, highlight their daily implementation bottlenecks, and to put forward tangible actions to improve regulation, funding and knowledge exchange. At the same time, the UAEU is in a transition towards a new phase. ON THE OCCASION OF THE INFORMAL MINISTERIAL MEETING ON HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE SPANISH PRESIDENCY OF THE EU COUNCIL 13-14 NOVEMBER 2023

#### Housing for all in sustainable, healthy, and inclusive built environments

Major challenges have arisen in housing and urban development in the European Union in recent years, which have been aggravated by the COVID-19 pandemic and the conflict in Ukraine. Persistently high house prices, together with an increasing lack of affordable housing supply, are preventing European citizens from a received housing.

These difficulties gravely affect lower and middle-income households, young people, and vulnerable groups such as the elderly or people with disabilities, many of whom are deprived of the chance to access decent housing. According to the latest Eurostat data, 8.7 % of the population of the European Union, that is, more than 40.8 million people, allocate more than 40% of their income to pay for housing. A percentage that goes up to 20.8% when considering the set of households that reside in a rental dwelling at material price. Additionally, there has been a worrying increase in the number of homeless people over the past decade in most Member States.

Furthermore, with most of the European population living in urban areas, many European households face hurdles when it comes to finding suitable and affordable housing, especially in those areas and neighbourhoods with the highest demand. There is therefore a need to consider how urban and housing development policies can tackle supply challenges. It is also critical to consider the needs of people living in small towns, villages, and rural areas, who require specific strategies and policies. In most member states, the housing stock need to adapt to major challenges such as aging of the population or decreasing of the households' size.

Given this context, the right approach to address housing and urban development challenges in the European Union appears to be one based on collaboration between all levels of government (European, National, Regional and Local) through governance instruments. In this regard, the Urban Agenda for the European Union is a key instrument for multi-level governance.

We are also experiencing a huge transformation of our economic model towards a more sustainable one, guided by the European Green Deal. Sustainability is an area of huge potential for housing and urban development in the European Union, from a social, ecological and resilience perspective, to ensure that housing is adapted for climate change. The European building stock should be adapted to meet the demands ahead, in terms of quality, functionality and accessibility of buildings, as well as energy efficiency and conservation.

In order to put these ambitions into practice, Member States should seize the opportunities offered by the European Union funding from multiannual financial framework and the "Next Generation EU" funds.

# Compact Cities Sustainable Urban Planning and Sprawl Mitigation

#### Thematic scope

- Understanding what drivers influence the supply of - and demand for - developable land in urban regions
- Enhancing the **operationalisation** of sustainable urbanisation concepts
- Focusing on containing urban sprawl through densification, regeneration and containment
- Addressing trade-offs between dimensions of sustainability and systemic barriers to compact urban development
- Improving the understanding and implementation of transectoral policies, regulation and funding that impact the form of urban development - from transport policies, land regulation and affordable housing to infrastructure retrofitting and FUA coordination
