
MULTIPLIER EFFECT — for every €10 invested

- Projects launched in key fields: business infrastructure, tourism, energy
- Initially supported through loans, then reimbursed with EU funds
- Priority to projects with economic added value (revenue-generating or loss-reducing)
- Partnership with the European Investment Bank (EIB) - finances a portfolio of projects for Oradea
- Combination of sources ensures sustainability & continuity
- Savings and revenues are reinvested into new projects

Industrial & Smart Specialisation Parks

4 Industrial Parks

Industrial Park 1 - EU Funded ROP 2007-2013:

> Total investment: 20 mil Euro (50% European funds)

> Hypo Bank Credit: €10.3 million loan

Residents: 52 companies (7995 jobs)

Private investments worth: € 462 mil

Industrial Park 2 & 3 & 4:

Local budget funded: € 7.9 mil

Residents: 96 companies (3400 jobs)

Private investments worth: € 195 mil

Park 4 - under development





2 Smart Specialisation Parks - EU funded contribution:

40%, Local contribution: 60%

SME Support Non-reimbursable funding secured: €8 mil for high added-value economic activities based on advanced technologies, innovation, and knowledge

BUSINESS INCUBATOR - CRESC

- Investment value: 3,6 millions euros (50% European funds)
- ▶ Loan: €1.1 mil
- Opportunity for selected companies to access start-up support services across pre-incubation, incubation, and post-incubation stages.
- ▶ Incubated Companies: 26 (target 31 companies until Dec 2026)





Incubated companies will:

- Receive support in developing business strategies
- Be hosted in the Business Incubator building
- Benefit from consultancy and office space
- Participate in trainings, seminars, and conferences
- Receive assistance in attracting funding.



ORADEA INTERMODAL HUB

- ➤ The only intermodal center financed by POIM 2014 2020
- Total project value (VAT included): ~ € 14,8 mil
- Non-refundable project value: € 9,8 mil UE 66%
- Project completed at 31.12.2023 6 months execution
- ➤ The only intermodal center financed by POIM 2014 2020

Impact

- Storage capacity increased 1.5x in Oradea's multimodal centers
- ▶ Mandling of approx. 10,600 TEU/year
- ➤ Reduced road congestion → fewer accidents, lower emissions
 & noise
- \triangleright **k** Socio-economic growth \rightarrow budget revenues & new jobs
- Improved freight transport with positive effects on environment & safety







Business centers for local producers



Cetate - Entrepreneurship Center:

- > Funded by Interreg V-A Romania-Hungary Program 2014–2020
- Phase 1 (completed): Budget: €6.5M (Loan €3.2M, EU contribution €2M 45.56%)
- Phase 2 (ongoing): Budget: Local €16M, Loan €11M

Rogerius - Entrepreneurship Center:

- ▶ Funded by Interreg Hungary-Romanian Program 2007-2013
- Project value: € 6.7 mil (Loan: € 2.7 mil), UE 98% € 6.6 mil

Overall Market Post-Modernization

- ≥ 1900 traders & local individual producers selling directly to consumers
- Mix of local producers and commercial operators
- Managed by ADP Oradea (public authority) ensures infrastructure & regulation
- Example of public-private partnership fostering local economy









Total Investment value – Business Projects: € 93 mil

Financing: Domestic Loan/EIB Financing €28.4 mil

Non-refundable funds: 33 mil EUR

Total Public Contribution: 60 mil EUR









Tool 2: Funding Treasure Map – Cluj Metropolitan Area
